our tables covered with lavender gingham table cloths, and lavender blue butterfly flowers. Nancy also provided us with complimentary starter containers of lavender, and I can tell you ours are doing great!

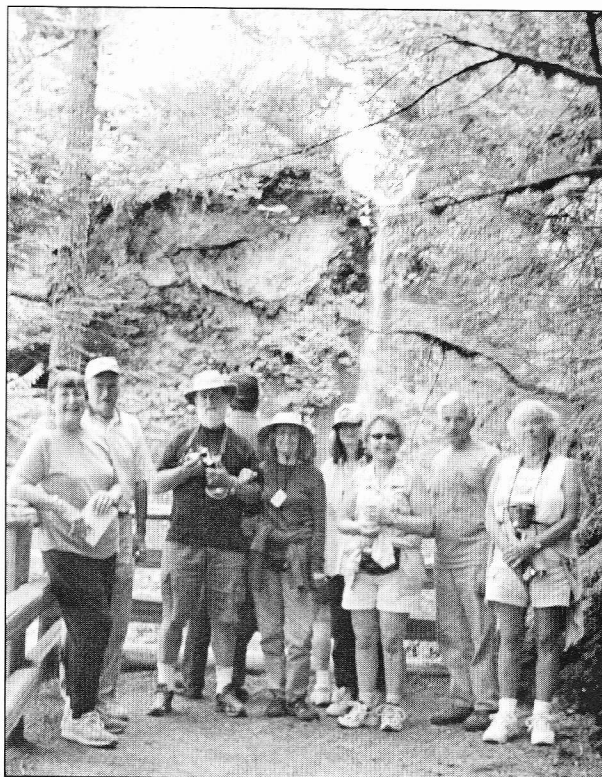

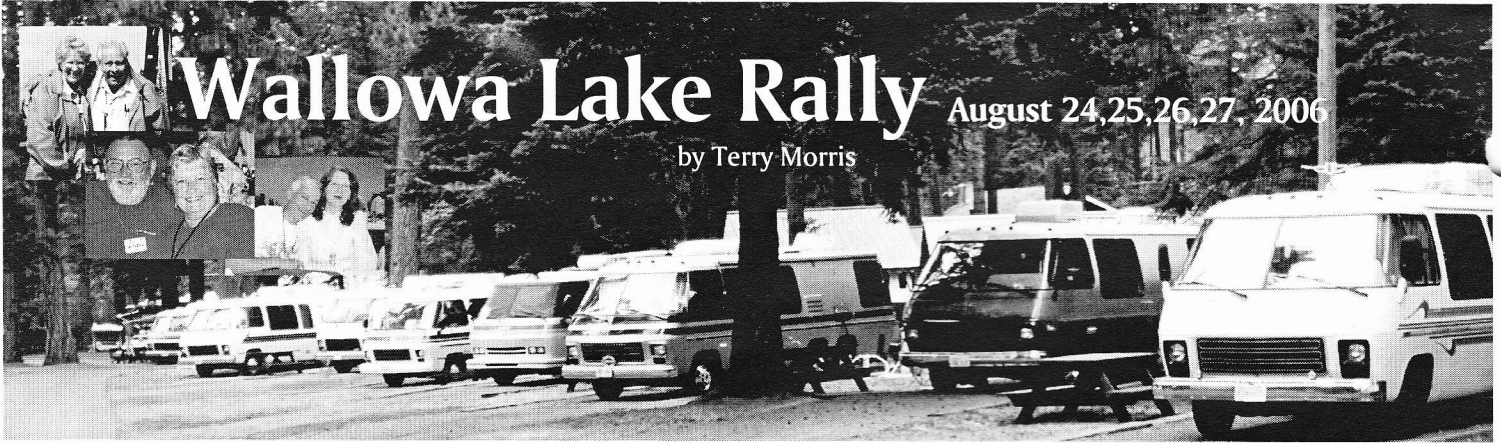
